→ HOW DID YOU GET THIS ROLE?

In my last year of school (Year 13), Waikato-Tainui was doing a young trades programme. So in the last 6 months of school, I finished school to join the programme and chose to do electrical. I was interested in electrical from the start and didn't really want to do building or plumbing. They put me through ETCO – which is the main training body for apprentices. So they put me into placement and I started work!

→ WHAT DO YOU DO ON THE JOB?

Running cables, installing different switch gear powerpoints, switches, installing tray and ducting, which holds cables allowing them to run underground.

→ WHAT DO YOU LOVE ABOUT YOUR JOB?

I love looking back at what I've done. Seeing what I've accomplished and being proud of it is very rewarding. It's a really rewarding job!

→ WHAT HAVE YOU LEARNT ON THE JOB?

I've learnt a lot of different skills! Learning that you don't always get it right the first time, you're going to mess up quite a bit but as long as you learn from your mistakes and just keep getting better it will all be rewarding in the end because you'll know what you're doing.

WHAT DO YOU LIKE MOST ABOUT WORKING AT ETCO/FEISST ELECTRICAL?

Good crew, and I've already built good relationships with them here – I've only been here a little over a month. I find it easy to learn from them, they have a lot of knowledge.
